### COURSE OBJECTIVES:

This course explores the loving relationship we have with God and our response in prayer, worship and the sacraments. The sacraments are a way to create holiness in ourselves, build up the Body of Christ and to worship God. Since the sacraments are an integral part of what it means to be Catholic: it is essential for us to understand how God is revealing Himself to us in the sacraments. The following topics will be studied during the academic year.

  - Holy Orders - The Sacrament of Christian Service
  - Christian Marriage / Vocations - The Sacrament of Friendship and love for Others.

Please note that the order of the topics may vary in order to more closely follow the Liturgical seasons. Students will also participate in liturgical and prayer ministries. Our school liturgies will be prepared and celebrated through the leadership of our Senior 2 Religion students.
